Key Verse: Psalm 40:1-3

Subject: "A Believer With A Testimony"

Introduction: The book of Psalms, this Jewish hymn book; this collection of songs which was penned by several different Holy Ghost inspired writers; Psalms is full of lyrics that minister to us in each and every circumstance of the heart.

Dr. C.I. Scofield, a noted American theologian, would write that in the collection of Psalms we find inspiration clothed in human experience with a universal quality that has brought comfort, strength, and guidance to countless believers down through the ages.

This fortieth number of Psalms is:

- a song learned in tribulation, yet it is song of divine deliverance
- a song of forgiveness and a song that is permeated with praise and thanksgiving
- a song of worship, but this is also a song that instills the belief of patiently waiting on the Lord
