C. S. Lewis, a literary scholar and Anglican lay theologian said: "I think we delight to praise what we enjoy because praise not merely expresses but completes the enjoyment."

Praise is an active expression!

Every now and then, the fire that's shut up down on the inside of the saved and sanctified; that inward profession of faith that holds us to the Rock of your salvation, ought to show up on the outside as a crazy praise.
